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### **HELPING STUDENTS READ BETTER AND LEARN MORE**

The Iowa Reading Research Center provides comprehensive support for all aspects of literacy education, using practices aligned to the science of reading. We provide direct support for students and families, deliver professional learning for educators, and conduct research and evaluation studies, all of which are intended to foster student success and achievement.

#### **SUPPORT**

From the time students begin learning to read and write to the day they graduate high school, the Iowa Reading Research Center supports them and their families. At our free in-person or virtual assistive technology consultation appointments, we demonstrate to caregivers and their children tablet and laptop applications that can help children and teens complete reading and writing tasks. We also provide literacy resources, including our seasonal writing prompts, which can be used at home or at school. Writing responses to these standards-aligned prompts can help students strengthen skills such as crafting a narrative and developing an argument.

#### **PROFESSIONAL LEARNING**

With the expertise earned through completing the new Dyslexia Specialist Endorsement program coordinated by the Iowa Reading Research Center, endorsees can conduct assessments, gather data, design targeted literacy instruction for students, and more. In 2022, 18 educators completed all requirements to earn the endorsement, becoming the first in Iowa to have earned that designation. The Iowa Reading Research Center also offers professional development anytime, anywhere through its eLearning. Modules on literacy instructional topics and other relevant topics are free to all Iowa educators.
