

Forming Opinions Graphic Organizer

Teaching children to form opinions about what they have read can help them engage more deeply with the texts they are exposed to. It is also a skill that can support students' reading comprehension. This graphic organizer is intended to help students organize their thoughts about a text and frame those thoughts as different types of opinion statements. Students can fill out this organizer after reading or listening to a book at home or in the classroom.
