

Sequencing Graphic Organizer

One way to evaluate students' comprehension of a story they have read or listened to is by asking them retell the story in their own words. Students who adequately understand a text are able to identify the story's characters, settings, and sequence of events. This graphic organizer allows students to organize their thoughts as they retell a story. After reading or listening to a story, students write or draw a picture of each story element in its corresponding box. This can help students self-monitor for comprehension and can also help caregivers and educators check for understanding.
