RESOURCES

From the time students begin learning to read and write and beyond, the Iowa Reading Research Center supports them and their families. Our Caregivers Resource Hub provides eLearning modules and resources families can support their children's use development. At our free resource consultation appointments, we connect families with tools that can support their children and teens with reading and writing tasks. Our FastBridge Recommendations Tool offers guidance to teachers based on student assessment scores. We also provide literacy and learning resources, including podcasts, writing prompts, lesson plans, and activities.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

With consultation services and professional development opportunities like our annual lowa Science of Reading Summit, we are dedicated to providing high-quality professional learning on evidence-based literacy instruction and intervention. Through graduate-level courses and practicum experiences, the Dyslexia Specialist Endorsement program prepares teachers to effectively address the needs of students with dyslexia. The lowa Reading Research Center also offers professional development anytime, anywhere through its eLearning. Modules on literacy instructional topics and other relevant topics are free to all lowa educators.



RESEARCH

Our literacy research and evaluation studies identify effective methods to teach and assess literacy skills. This work guides data-based decision-making practices and informs highquality professional learning for educators. Our findings also provide guidance for school districts and inform literacy legislation and policy. Within the rich academic environment of the University of Iowa College of Education, the Iowa Reading Research Center is equipped to pursue new research projects that stem from the science of reading.
