

Word Building Graphic Organizer

A *morpheme* is the smallest unit of meaning in language. Morphological ability can help students improve their vocabulary and reading comprehension. By applying the Word Building Strategy, students combine morphemes to create new words and meanings. Through the strategy, students apply their understanding of how word parts contribute to meaning and grammatical function.

The Word Building Strategy consists of three basic steps:

- **Build words:** Students select and physically move morpheme cards to build new words.
- **Record and reflect:** Students complete the Word Building Graphic Organizer, recording the morphemes, definition, and grammatical function of each word they create.
- **Apply in context:** Students use their generated words in written sentences.
